This list of key points has been collated during initial discussion, and is subject to change following further refinement and debate.

- Define the goals for collaboration/cooperation
- Ensure close cooperation/collaboration
 - Avoid duplication of work
 - Sharing of OMA WIDs / 3GPP2 WI Proposals as early as possible in their lifecycle.
 - Mutual monitoring of work plans.
 - Ensure an understanding of respective roles and responsibilities re work plans and monitoring
 - Define and track mutual dependencies
 - 3GPP2 PMT / OMA RP&M.
 - Liaison communication and cooperation between 3GPP2 and OMA.
 - Establish defined communication points in both organisations.
 - Define review periods for 3GPP2 etc. for OMA documents (& vice versa).
 - Establish a common terminology (or mapping) between OMA and 3GPP2.
 - Joint meetings are non decision making
 - needs ratification by respective organisation
 - Coordinated interaction with 3rd parties where applicable (e.g. IETF)
- Encourage more 3GPP2 community participation in OMA.
- Ensure OMA's technology "agnostic goals" are reflected in its "working practices".
- OMA to clarify "Openness" policy.
- OMA response re "plan to change" or "work around"
 - IPR RAND policy for "all" not "just OMA members"
 - Work around proposal – TIA etc. to poll OMA members who claim essential IPR for acceptance of RAND.
